

What is a Summative Assessment?

1. It is the culmination of the teaching/learning process of each subject specific unit.
2. The summative assessment should measure the understanding of **key and related concepts** and also **move the student towards action**.
3. Summative assessments are completed after the student has been given substantial opportunities for growth and development via the formative tasks.
4. Summative assessments are recorded on Synergy.
5. Summative assessments use a 0-8 Scale
6. Summative assessments have a rubric attach with descriptors.

Each band has its own unique descriptor that teachers use to make judgments about students' progress and achievement.
